Neva is a river in northwestern Russia flowing from Lake Ladoga through the western part of Leningrad Oblast to the Neva Bay of the Gulf of Finland.

Bolshaya Neva is the largest armlet of Neva River. It starts near the Vasilievsky Island's Strelka (easternmost tip of the island). Its tributaries are Fontanka, Moyka and Novo-Admiralteysky Canal. There are two bridges across Bolshaya Neva: Palace Bridge and Blagoveshchensky Bridge.

Malaya Neva is the second largest distributary of the Neva River. Malaya Neva is the northern armlet of the Neva river near the Vasilievsky Island's Strelka (easternmost tip of the island), in the historic center of the city of Saint Petersburg. There are two bridges across Malaya Neva: Exchange Bridge and Tuchkov Bridge.

Bolshaya Nevka is an arm of the Neva that begins about 1 kilometre (0.6 mi) below the Liteyny Bridge in Saint Petersburg. There are three bridges across Bolshaya Nevka: Sampsonievskij Bridge, Grenader Bridge and Kantemirovskij Bridge.
